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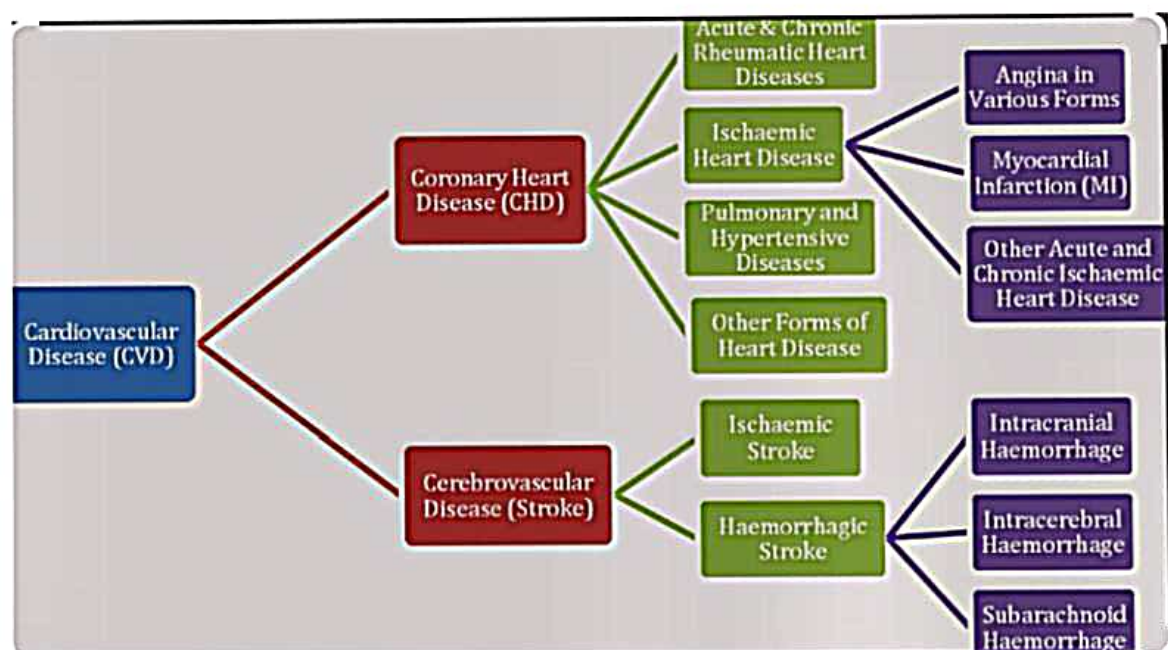
Introduction

In the 21st century, cardiovascular diseases (CVDs) have become the leading cause of death in the world as well as in the Indian population. CVD is a type of heart disease that affects the blood vessels and the heart. According to the global burden of disease study (2010), CVD mortality is higher than the global death rate. The CVD death rate in India is 272 per 100,000 people, while the general population death rate is 235 per 100,000 people (GBD 2010). CVDs, also known as silent killers, are the leading cause of disease burden and death globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) estimates that India will lose \$237 billion in productivity and healthcare costs over the next ten years as a result of the existing CVD burden (2005-2015). As a result of the country's rapid economic development following independence, CVDs and their risk factors have increased dramatically in India. As a result, they've risen to the top of the non-communicable disease-related death toll. The most common types of risk factors for heart disease are modifiable and non-modifiable risk factors ((Yusuf et al., 2004). Modifiable risk factors include hypertension (HTN), diabetes mellitus (DM), metabolic disease, long-term alcohol consumption, excessive tobacco consumption, and viral infection. Age, gender, race, and a family history of heart disease are all non-modifiable risk factors (Yusuf et al., 2004). The frequency of causing CVDs is higher in urban areas than in rural areas because urban people live a different lifestyle than people in rural areas (WHO 2011). Long-term consequences of such risk factors include high blood pressure, blood glucose, and lipid levels, as well as being overweight or obese (Hunter and Reddy 2013). Strokes and cardiac arrests are two of the most serious consequences of these risk factors. Most CVDs are preventable if risk factors are addressed. Preventative measures include living a healthy lifestyle, taking prescribed medications, and undergoing medical procedures or surgery. The burden of cardiovascular disease in men was twice that of women for ischemic heart disease, cardiomyopathy, and myocarditis. Premature deaths due to CVDs between the ages of 30 and 70 years

were 0.108 for men and 0.067 for women globally in 2013, with men from Eastern Europe and women from Oceania having the highest numbers and the lowest for both sexes in the high-income Asia-Pacific region (Gregory et al., 2015). East Asian countries attributed 40% of deaths to CVDs in 2013, with a ratio of ischemic stroke and IHD mortality of 0.54-1.06 compared to Latin America (<0.4). South Asian countries accounted for 27% of CVD deaths in 2013, which is higher than the 15% reported in 1990 (Roth et al., 2018). CVD affects the Indian population a decade earlier than their Western counterparts, causing 23% of deaths in the age group under 70 years, while in the Indian population this number rises to 52%. (Harikrishnan et al., 2014). Maternal disorders, measles, protein-energy malnutrition, and diarrheal diseases have decreased by more than half in the last 20 years, but life expectancy at birth has increased from 58.3 to 65.2 years, resulting in population ageing (GBD Profile, 2014). When compared to the Global Burden of Diseases in 2010, there is a higher proportion of deaths attributed to CVD (30% to 42%) and an age-standardized CVD mortality rate (255-225 per 100000 population in men and 225-299 per 100000 population in women) (Pednekar et al., 2011, Soman et al., 2011, Joshi et al., 2006). IHD prevalence was 2% in 1960 and has risen to 14% in 2013 (Gupta, 2008). IHD and stroke account for the majority of CVD mortality (83%) with IHD being more prevalent (GBD Compare, 2010). Stroke and stroke-related cases are more common in India than in western industrialised countries (Das and Banerjee, 2008). IHD and stroke together accounted for more than one-fifth (21.1%) of all deaths in 2010. (GBD Profile, 2014). In 2013, hypertensive heart disease increased by 138 percent, resulting in 261694 deaths compared to 1990. (Naghavi et al., 2015). The prevalence of hypertensive heart disease ranges from 1.5 to 2 per 1000 people (2-2.5 million cases) (Kumar and Tandon 2013). According to various epidemiological studies, there were over 30 million coronary heart disease patients in 2012, resulting in a 7 percent to 13 percent prevalence of CHD in various parts of the urban population (Mohan et al., 2001,

Gupta et al., 2002) and 2 percent to 7 percent in rural populations (Mohan et al., 2001, Gupta et al., 2002). (Kumar et al., 2006). According to the GBD study, DALYS lost by CHD in the Indian population in 1990 were 5.6 million in men and 4.5 million in women, and are expected to be 14.4 million and 7.7 million in men and women respectively by 2020. (Ezzati et al., 2004).

Classification of cardiovascular disease



According to the World Heart Federation, there are six basic categories of CVDs. (i) Cerebrovascular disorders (ii) ischemic heart disease (iii) Hypertensive heart disease (iv) Rheumatic heart illnesses (v) Inflammatory heart diseases (vi) Cardiomyopathy

(a) Cerebrovascular diseases impair the blood vessels and blood supply to the brain, resulting in a stroke. The most common types are deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and atherosclerosis, followed by stroke, transient ischemic attack, aneurysms, and vascular malformations. Early warning signs include weakness and communication difficulties. The primary risk factors are hypertension,

smoking, obesity, and diabetes. Congenital risk factors include arteriovenous malformations, germinal matrix haemorrhage, and CADASIL (cerebral autosomal dominant arteriopathy with subcortical infarcts and leukoencephalopathy) (Townsend et al., 2017).

(b) Ischemic heart disease is caused by a constriction of the heart arteries, resulting in decreased blood flow and thus less oxygen. A heart attack, also known as a myocardial infarction, occurs when untreated ischemic heart disease causes a blockage of blood flow to a specific region of the heart, causing pain in the left arm and shoulder.

(c) High blood pressure over a long period causes hypertensive heart disease. The left ventricle imposes a response on the heart by increasing arterial pressure and total peripheral resistance (Frohlich et al., 1992).

(d) Rheumatic heart disease is a condition that develops when rheumatic fever causes damage to the heart valves. This is caused primarily by a streptococcal infection, which weakens the immune system and damages the valves. It can also be caused by ageing or congenital defects. This promotes valve scarring, resulting in blood backflow and decreased cardiac function.

(e) Inflammatory heart disorders are caused by myocarditis or inflammation of the heart muscles. The most common causes are bacterial, viral, tuberculosis, cancer, poisonous gases, and pollution. The most common symptoms are chest pain, angina, edema, fatigue, and swelling of the feet and ankles.

(f) Cardiomyopathy is a group of diseases that affects heart muscles and makes it the heart difficult to pump blood resulting in heart failure.

Materials and Methods

Present study is descriptive cross-sectional and observational-based study. The public survey was carried out from January 2024 to March 2024. The study was carried out in Deola taluka (Nashik) town. Deola (20.4604° N, 74.1829° E) is a Taluka (Fig.2) located in the Maharashtra (India). The entire Taluka is predominantly rural and has agricultural and pastoral economy. An extensive data sheet was prepared to ascertain the causes of the CVD. 86 people were included in this study. Datasheets were structured in standard data collection forms to include as much information about CVD patients as possible. The Datasheets contained all of the information. Age, symptoms, smoking and alcohol consumption history and family history were all listed on the datasheet.

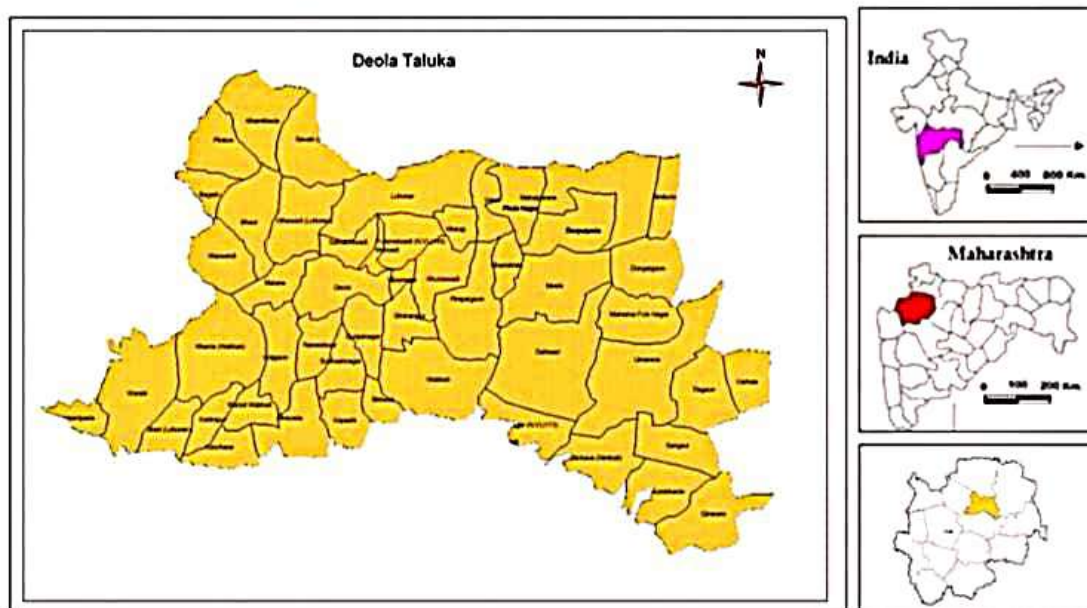


Figure 1. Deola Taluka Map

Statistical analysis

All parameters were reported as means with standard deviations (SEM), and data were divided into five age groups: <20 years, 21-40 years, 41-60 years, and 61-80 years.

Distribution of Cardiovascular disease

We observed approximately 86 patients were diagnosed with a different heart disease at Deola taluka. We observed that the number of male patients was higher than the number of female patients. There were approximately 62 male patients and 24 female patients. We observed that 73% were male and 27% female (**Table 1**).

A total of 86 patients (62 men and 24 women) with various cardiac diseases were examined in the Deola population for the current study. CVD prevalence was divided into 20-year age groups to determine the percentage of people with the disease. We observed an increase in the prevalence of several cardiac diseases with increasing age, with a higher percentage in the

41–60-year-old age group 49 (56.97 %). CVDs were observed very less in the age group <20, it was 5 (5.81 %). The total prevalence in the age group 21–40 years was 23(26.74) with males accounting for 18(20.93) and females accounting for 23(26.74). In the >80-year-old age group, we found a lower percentage of CVDs (Table 2).

Risk factor

Males had higher rates of various etiological distributions such as HTN, DM, smoking, and alcohol consumption and tobacco chewing intake than women. Male patients observed a significantly higher percentage of hypertension 34 than female patients 10. Similarly, diabetes mellitus was also more prevalent in males 21 than females 6. While smoking and alcohol consumption were present only in males and absent in female patients. Tobacco chewing habit was present in male 28 and female 5 (Table 3).

Fig 2. Distribution of Risk factor in Deola taluka population

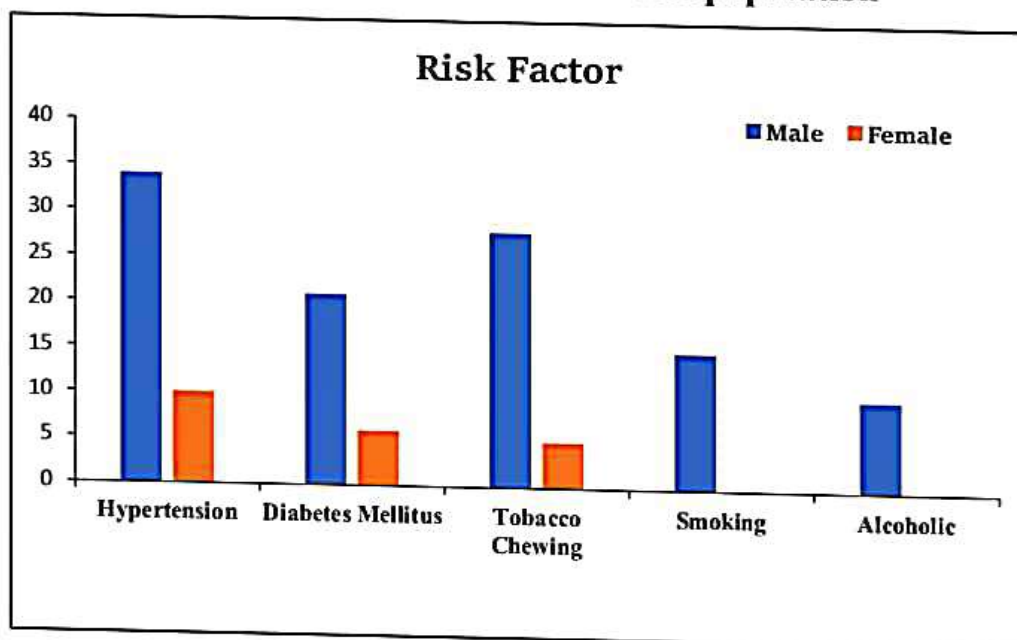

CONCLUSION

Cardiovascular disease was more common in males than females and the ratio was 3:1. Ageing, age-related comorbidities and lifestyle negatively impact the phenotypic expressions of CVD. CVD is distributed in people of all ages, but it is more prevalent in those over the age of 40 years. Male patients had significantly more risk factors for cardiac disease than female patients. Based on these findings, it is possible to conclude that CVDs is very common among male patients. The data generated could be used as a base for future studies.

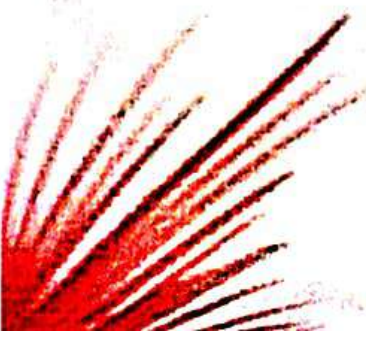

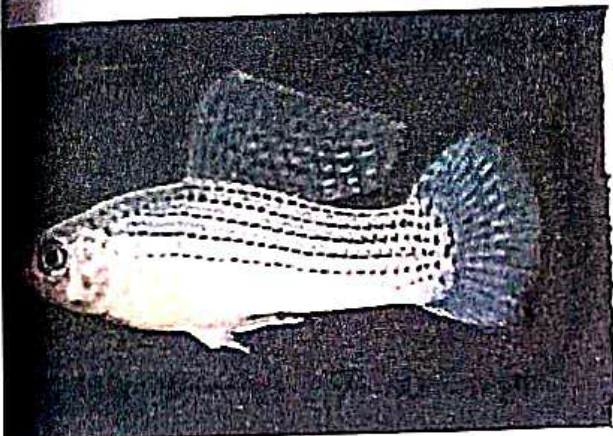

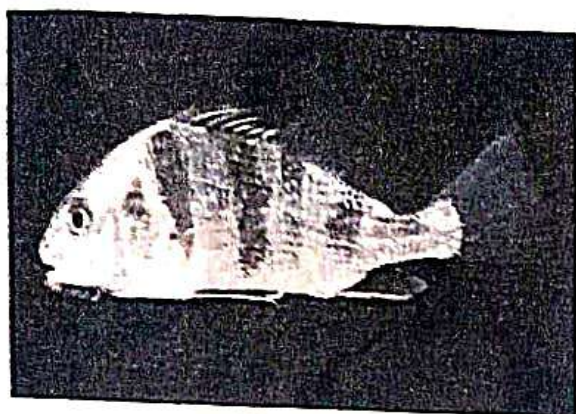
Habitat and Habit

Report

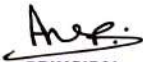

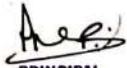
